******* NOTE *******

Coggins : All horses arriving at Living Wells Farm are required to have in their possession the **original** results of a current (within a year) negative Coggins test as well as a copy for our files before unloading from the trailer. (Please note that if you are trailering your horse through the state of New Hampshire, the Coggins test must be dated within 6 months as required by that state.)

Vaccines: All horses arriving at Living Wells Farm are required to have a copy of current (within a year) vaccines which include Rabies, Strangles, 3 way (Eastern, Western, & Tetanus), and West Nile. Horses are required to have inoculations yearly.

Fecal Tests & Deworming: All horses must provide the results of a fecal count fewer than 10 within 6 months of arriving at the farm or have the test done within 2 weeks after arrival. All horses will be dewormed by the owner or the barn manager (fees applied) according to a schedule approved by the barn manager. Horses must have fecal tests annually.
